# The Story of Camp Skylark...

The Fraser Canyon Hospice Society is an organization that offers people in the community of Hope, BC supports in grief and in end of life issues.

We historically offered bereavement supports for adults, but soon realized that the younger members in families we supported needed help too.

The idea of Camp Skylark was born.



It started as an idea, grew to the development of a plan and evolved into a weekend of memories that have changed the lives of both campers and our dedicated volunteers alike.

Every year we hold our bereavement camp at Camp Squeah, a gorgeous area set amongst the mountains just minutes outside of beautiful Hope, BC. This setting provides our campers with all the amenities of a traditional camp, as well as a peaceful place to come and be supported in their grief.

Camp Skylark was created by a group of volunteers who were dedicated to finding a way to help grieving children. Many of our volunteers travel from across BC to be a part of camp, and quite a few of them have experienced grief and loss in their lives.

This is a place for children to come together and know they are not alone. The most important thing is however, that children are just allowed to be children and enjoy nature at the same time.

We work diligently fund- raising year round, which allows us to offer attendance at camp to 25 children free of charge.
